## **El Centro College President Dr. Paul McCarthy Joins TWC to Outline Effective Use of Federal Stimulus Training Dollars**

AUSTIN — Leaders from the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC), community colleges, workforce boards, and business and industry gathered today in Austin to discuss the most effective use of Texas training funds included in the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA). TWC has allocated more than \$150 million in ARRA funds to 28 local workforce boards across the state to support training and to help Texans find jobs.

“Newly available training funds should be targeted to bolster the skills of Texans who are out of work in order to help them get good jobs once our economy begins to recover,” said TWC Chairman Tom Pauken.

The money will expand existing Workforce Investment Act programs for adult, youth, and dislocated workers, and Wagner-Peyser Employment Services in local communities.

“El Centro College’s Bill Priest Institute for Economic Development has years of experience working with manufacturers in Dallas County,” said Dr. Paul McCarthy, president of El Centro College in the Dallas County Community College District. “Combining the resources and expertise of the college, the business partners, and the Texas Manufacturing Assistance Center, and with the assistance of the Texas Workforce Commission’s Skills Development Fund grant program, we work with a group of manufacturers that are committed to expanding the talents of their existing collective workforce through the training and development of their employees.”

McCarthy was a speaker on the Advanced Manufacturing Initiative.

ARRA encourages local workforce boards to enter into contracts with community colleges to provide job training tailored to the needs of area business and industry. Other strategies include providing short-term training to large numbers of prospective workers.
